



## CGCB LOCAL RULES – GREEN COURSE

### 1. OUT OF BOUNDS (RULE 2.1)

The boundaries of the course are defined by white lines and stakes, electric fence posts, wire mesh fencing, and white-painted fences marking the course boundary, in that order of precedence. The gardens and private properties adjoining the course, as well as all paved roads, including sidewalks, are also out of bounds.

### 2. PENALTY AREAS (RULE 17)

- In Penalty Areas (PAs) where sections are bordered by **wooden boards**, the boundary is defined by the edge of the boards nearest the water.
- In Penalty Areas marked by **only a few stakes**, **the stakes indicate but do not define the boundary**. The boundary of the Penalty Area is defined either by painted lines or by the beginning of the depression containing the area, in that order of precedence.
- When a Penalty Area is marked by wire mesh fencing, the base of the fence posts defines the boundary of the Penalty Area.

### 3. SPECIAL RELIEF PROCEDURES

### 4. ABNORMAL COURSE CONDITIONS AND INTEGRAL OBJECTS

#### IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS (RULE 16.1)

In addition to those defined as such by the Rules:

- **Hole 16** – The road crossing the hole, together with the posts and boards defining it, are considered a single obstruction when determining the nearest point of complete relief.
- All paved paths on the course.
- The **concrete footings** of out-of-bounds fences are **integral objects** and form part of the course. No free relief is available from this condition.
