



## CGCB LOCAL RULES – RED COURSE

### 1. OUT OF BOUNDS (RULE 2.1)

The boundaries of the course are defined by lines, stakes, electric fence posts, wire mesh fencing, white-painted fences, and walls marking the course boundary, in that order of precedence, as well as all **fairways**, including their sidewalks.

### 2. IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS (RULE 16.1)

In addition to those defined as such by the Rules:

- a) **Hole 7** – The road crossing the hole, together with the posts and boards defining it, are considered a single obstruction when determining the nearest point of complete relief.
- b) Asphalted paths and the **guardrails** alongside them are considered a single obstruction. At **Hole 12**, balls lying on the path may be dropped within one club-length of the nearest point of complete relief, not nearer the hole, on the left-hand side of the path.
- c) The **concrete footings** of out-of-bounds fences are integral objects **and form part of the course**. No relief is available from this condition.
- d) All asphalted paths on the course.

### 3. PENALTY AREAS (RULE 17)

- a) In Penalty Areas (PAs) marked by stakes, the **stakes indicate but do not define the boundary**. The boundary of the Penalty Area is defined either by painted lines or by the beginning of the depression containing the area, in that order of precedence.
- b) In Penalty Areas where sections are bordered by **wooden boards**, the boundary of the Penalty Area is defined by the edge of the boards nearest the water.
- c) When **stakes** indicating a Penalty Area are located along the edge of a paved buggy path, the boundary of the Penalty Area is defined either by painted lines or by the edge of the path itself, in that order of precedence.
- d) When a Penalty Area is marked **by fencing or wire mesh**, the base of the fence posts defines the boundary of the Penalty Area.
- e) **Hole 12** – A dropping zone is available for balls that cross the Penalty Area through the section marked by guardrails painted red and white.

### 4. WASTE AREAS

These are areas devoid of grass and covered with **tree bark**. They are part of the General Area and are treated as rough. A ball lying in such an area is in play and must be played as it lies, with no relief available.

### 5. ABNORMAL COURSE CONDITIONS (RULE 16)

#### a) Ground Under Repair

A dropping zone is provided to the left of the green on Hole 1 for balls lying in the area marked GUR (Ground Under Repair), where play is prohibited.

### 6. PLACING THE BALL (As indicated on the Caddie Master notice board)

Committee Procedures – Model Local Rule 8E-3: 20 centimetres (8 inches).

Penalty for Breach of **this Local Rule** : Stroke Play: **Two-stroke penalty**. Match Play: **Loss of hole**.
